Year C

First Reading - Acts 13:14, 43-52

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Paul and Barnabas carried on from Perga till they reached Antioch in Pisidia. Here they went to synagogue on the sabbath and took their seats.

When the meeting broke up, many Jews and devout converts joined Paul and Barnabas, and in their talks with them Paul and Barnabas urged them to remain faithful to the grace God had given them.

The next sabbath almost the whole town assembled to hear the word of God. When they saw the crowds, the Jews, prompted by jealousy, used blasphemies and contradicted everything Paul said. Then Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly, 'We had to proclaim the word of God to you first, but since you have rejected it, since you do not think yourselves worthy of eternal life, we must turn to the pagans. For this is what the Lord commanded us to do when he said:

I have made you a light for the nations,

so that my salvation may reach the ends of the earth.'

It made the pagans very happy to hear this and they thanked the Lord for his message; all who were destined for eternal life became believers. Thus the word of the Lord spread through the whole countryside.

But the Jews worked upon some of the devout women of the upper classes and the leading men of the city and persuaded them to turn against Paul and Barnabas and expel them from their territory. So they shook the dust from their feet in defiance and went off to Iconium; but the disciples were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit.

Second Reading - Rv 7:9, 14-17

A reading from the book of the Apocalypse

I, John, saw a huge number, impossible to count, of people from every nation, race, tribe and language; they were standing in front of the throne and in front of the Lamb, dressed in white robes and holding palms in their hands. One of the elders said to me, 'These are the people who have been through the great persecution, and because they have washed their robes white again in the blood of the Lamb, they now stand in front of God's throne and serve him day and night in his sanctuary; and the One who sits on the throne will spread his tent over them. They will never hunger or thirst again; neither the sun nor scorching wind will ever plague them, because the Lamb who is at the throne will be their shepherd and will lead them to springs of living water; and God will wipe away all tears from their eyes.'

Following Jesus

Loyalty isn't discussed much these days. It can seem like a rather strange question: where do your loyalties lie? An older generation might still point to country or church, but the current generation would likely associate their loyalties with what matters to them more personally, their families or friends, or even themselves. Either way, their loyalties indicate what they choose above other things.

The question about loyalty asks us to think about the kinds of relationships that define us, that move us to act for something, and that give us something meaningful and worthwhile. Loyalty is really about an exchange of gifts. It's about living according to the authority of something good.

If we focus on relationships, choices and exchanges of gifts, we can probably see loyalties around us every day. There's a mother who turns down a promotion and a more demanding job so she can drop off and collect her daughter from school; a teacher who takes the time to listen to his/her students when they need it; and a woman with a bad hip who allows herself an hour to walk to morning Mass each day. Loyalties to people, virtues, values – these we can see quite easily (and thankfully) when we look for them, even if the word 'loyalty' isn't used.

When Jesus presents himself as the shepherd in today's gospel, he uses words and ideas that also aren't often used anymore: "My sheep hear my voice. I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they will never perish." But even if people tend not to think of themselves as 'sheep' or 'followers', or even of receiving eternal life (at least in the here and now of this life), they know something about loyalty. They also know about relationships that are crucial to who we are and who we become, about exchanges of gifts, and about choice and sacrifice for something good. And because they know about living for the people they love and the genuine values they affirm, and because they know all too well about walking in dark valleys and needing and praying for comfort, they also know something about following Jesus.

May be the most Christian thing we can do this Easter season is to discern in others the ways their loyalties express and anticipate the reality of new life that Jesus promises to those who follow his way of self-sacrificing love for others. The church's language may not be what they use, but the sound of his voice may yet resonate in their tenderness, their perseverance, their commitment and their forgiveness. He knows them. And with Easter eyes we can see that they follow him by the life of love that they live.
