First Reading - Eccl 1:2; 2:21-23

A reading from the book of Ecclesiastes

Vanity of vanities, the Preacher says. Vanity of vanities. All is vanity!

For so it is that a man who has laboured wisely, skilfully and successfully must leave what is his own to someone who has not toiled for it at all. This, too, is vanity and great injustice; for what does he gain for all the toil and strain that he has undergone under the sun? What of all his laborious days, his cares of office, his restless nights? This, too, is vanity.

Second Reading - Col 3:1-5, 9-11

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Colossians

Since you have been brought back to true life with Christ, you must look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is, sitting at God's right hand. Let your thoughts be on heavenly things, not on the things that are on the earth, because you have died, and now the life you have is hidden with Christ in God. But when Christ is revealed – and he is your life – you too will be revealed in all your glory with him.

That is why you must kill everything in you that belongs only to earthly life; fornication, impurity, guilty passion, evil desires and especially greed, which is the same thing as worshipping a false god; and never tell each other lies. You have stripped off your old behaviour with your old self, and you have put on a new self which will progress towards true knowledge the more it is renewed in the image of its creator; and in that image there is no room for distinction between Greek and Jew, between the circumcised or the uncircumcised, or between barbarian and Scythian, slave and free man. There is only Christ: he is everything and he is in everything.

Gospel - Lk 12:13-21

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

A man in the crowd said to Jesus, 'Master, tell my brother to give me a share of our inheritance.' 'My friend,' he replied, 'who appointed me your judge, or the arbitrator of your claims?' Then he said to them, 'Watch, and be on your guard against avarice of any kind, for a man's life is not made secure by what he owns, even when he has more than he needs.'

Then he told them a parable: 'There was once a rich man who, having had a good harvest from his land, thought to himself, "What am I to do? I have not enough room to store my crops." Then he said, "This is what I will do; I will pull down my barns and build bigger ones, and store all my grain and my goods in them, and I will say to my soul: My soul, you have plenty of good things laid by for many years to come; take things easy, eat, drink, have a good time." But God said to him, "Fool! This very night the demand will be made for your soul; and this hoard of yours, whose will it be then?" So it is when a man stores up treasure for himself in place of making himself rich in the sight of God.'

Life in death

A group of us were once asked what we wanted more than anything else. The person next to me grimaced when my friend said, "an ecstatic death." Her answer sounded to him rather like a dark and provocative reply, as if she were confessing some strange, morbid fascination with dying or attempting to merely startle the interviewer. But I knew that he missed her point. She was talking not just about her death, but essentially about the kind of life she really wanted.

I tend to think that our views of life and death go together. Or at least our disposition toward dying often reveals more about how we approach life than anything else. Thomas Merton, the famous Trappist monk, once wrote about this coupling of meanings. He said that when we separate death from life, when we try to hide from or oppose death, seeing in death a menacing figure waiting to pounce on us just around some unknown corner of life, then death becomes for us the fear of life.

It stands outside us and goads us into anxiously attempting to solidify ourselves before it snatches us away. Our life becomes overly determined by our desire to possess and do enough to make ourselves into something real and lasting. But knowing that death separates us from our achievements and possessions definitively leaves us in the fearful situation of not possibly being able to fulfill the task. When death is simply the end of life, its termination, it does just that, Merton says, and well before we die.

But Merton says that we view death differently when we live differently. When we give up the hopeless task of doing or consuming "enough" before our time ends, we can then shift our focus in life to something other than ourselves. And then we can start living for others and move toward a different end (or goal) of life.

The gospel paradox of passing from death unto life inspires his insight: living for others entails dying to our own greed, resentment and pride, awakening to the expanding world around us in new and fresh ways, and discovering a much fuller and richer life than ever we could previously imagine. A life lived in love is a true, good life and this changes the meaning of death. Merton says it beautifully. Describing physical death as a final act of self-surrender, he writes, "This is the 'end of life,' not in the sense of termination, but in the sense of a *culminating gift*, the last free perfect act of love which is at once surrender and acceptance." (Love and Living, 103)

What do we really want? A larger barn for storing our rich harvest, as did the foolish man in the gospel or an ecstatic death? Either way, we can only live out our answer.
