

First Reading - Jer 38:4-6. 8-10**A reading from the prophet Jeremiah**

The king's leading men spoke to the king. 'Let Jeremiah be put to death: he is unquestionably disheartening the remaining soldiers in the city, and all the people too, by talking like this. The fellow does not have the welfare of this people at heart so much as its ruin.' 'He is in your hands as you know,' King Zedekiah answered 'for the king is powerless against you.' So they took Jeremiah and threw him into the well of Prince Malchiah in the Court of the Guard, letting him down with ropes. There was no water in the well, only mud, and into the mud Jeremiah sank.

Ebed-melech came out from the palace and spoke to the king. 'My lord king,' he said, 'these men have done a wicked thing by treating the prophet Jeremiah like this: they have thrown him into the well where he will die.' At this the king gave Ebed-melech the Cushite the following order: 'Take three men with you from here and pull the prophet Jeremiah out of the well before he dies.'

Second Reading - Heb 12:1-4**A reading from the letter to the Hebrews**

With so many witnesses in a great cloud on every side of us, we too, then, should throw off everything that hinders us, especially the sin that clings so easily, and keep running steadily in the race we have started. Let us not lose sight of Jesus, who leads us in our faith and brings it to perfection: for the sake of the joy which was still in the future, he endured the cross, disregarding the shameful of it, and from now on has taken his place at the right of God's throne. Think of the way he stood such opposition from sinners and then you will not give up for want of courage. In the fight against sin, you have not yet had to keep fighting to the point of death.

Gospel - Lk 12:49-53**A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke**

Jesus said to his disciples: 'I have come to bring fire to the earth, and how I wish it were blazing already! There is a baptism I must still receive, and how great is my distress till it is over!

'Do you suppose that I am here to bring peace on earth? No, I tell you, but rather division. For from now on a household of five will be divided: three against two and two against three; the father divided against the son, son against father, mother against daughter, daughter against mother, mother-in-law against daughter-in-law, daughter-in-law against mother-in-law.'

The Way, the Truth and the Life

Things won't always be easy and comfortable for us as Christians. Jesus' words in today's gospel, I have come to bring fire to the earth and division among people, division even in families, strike a startling and unsettling note. After all, the angels who appeared to the shepherds at Jesus' birth proclaimed peace on earth. But here Jesus tells the crowd that he has come not to bring peace, but fire and division.

Yet, if we reflect on Jesus' life, it is clear from the very beginning and throughout his life that he does indeed bring division. While the shepherds and the wise men came to worship him, King Herod sought to kill him. While many are deeply moved by his teaching and preaching and his miracles, some responded by plotting against him and conspiring to destroy him.

The point of the gospel's message is that following Jesus makes real demands of us, demands that can be very costly, as exemplified by the many Christian saints and martyrs through the ages. The gospel reminds us that Jesus who is the Way, the Truth and the Life necessarily throws into stark relief all in our world that is not right and true and good. It reminds that, as Jesus' followers, we are called to walk steadfastly and courageously in his way and to hold firmly and faithfully to the truth that he reveals.

But Jesus's words today are also a salutary reminder that our faith in Jesus and our commitment to live as Christians will sometimes bring us into conflict with others. It will cause divisions; because it will at times demand that we dissent from what might

be very popular views. Our faith in Jesus as the Way, the Truth and the Life will not let untruths go unchallenged or what is wrong go unopposed; nor will it sanction violence and destructiveness. This dissent and conflict on account of our faith will cause us pain and suffering, just as it did for the prophets of old, and the many saints and martyrs who gave their lives for their faith.

Today, St Luke in his gospel wants us all to understand that things won't always be easy and comfortable for us as Christians. We will face opposition and rejection in various forms, perhaps even persecution. We will also at times face division and disension, even among our families and within our community because of our Christian faith and what we believe to be good, right and true. The peace the angels proclaimed will indeed come, but not yet!

So today we pray, as today's reading from the Letter to the Hebrews exhorts us, not to lose sight of Jesus who leads us in our faith and brings it to perfection. And we pray for strength and courage, patience and perseverance to hold firm to our faith in Jesus who is the Way, the Truth and the Life.
