First Reading - Gen 12:1-4

A reading from the book of Genesis

The Lord said to Abram, 'Leave your country, your family and your father's house, for the land I will show you. I will make you a great nation; I will bless you and make your name so famous that it will be used as a blessing. I will bless those who bless you: I will curse those who slight you. All the tribes of the earth shall bless themselves by you.'

So Abram went as the Lord told him.

Second Reading - 2 Tm 1:8-10

A reading from the second letter of St Paul to Timothy

With me, bear the hardships for the sake of the Good News, relying on the power of God who has saved us and called us to be holy – not because of anything we ourselves have done but for his own purpose and by his own grace. This grace had already been granted to us, in Christ Jesus, before the beginning of time, but it has only been revealed by the Appearing of our saviour Christ Jesus. He abolished death, and he has proclaimed life and immortality through the Good News.

Gospel - Mt 17:1-9

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone. There in their presence he was transfigured; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became as white as the light. Suddenly Moses and Elijah appeared to them; they were talking with him. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Lord,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He was still speaking when suddenly a bright cloud covered them with shadow, and from the cloud there came a voice which said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour. Listen to him.' When they heard this, the disciples fell on their faces, overcome with fear. But Jesus came up and touched them. 'Stand up,' he said 'do not be afraid.' And when they raised their eyes they saw no one but only Jesus. As they came down from the mountain Jesus gave them this order. 'Tell no one about the vision until the Son of Man has risen from the dead.'

Walking with Jesus

Jesus told his closest followers that when he reached Jerusalem, he would be arrested by his enemies and tried, condemned and executed. Peter took Jesus aside and said that such a thing must never happen. Jewish thinking over the centuries had pictured the Messiah as a warrior-king who would drive out the Romans and make Israel a great kingdom. So Jesus had to change the disciples' way of thinking.

A few days later he took three of his closest followers, Peter, James and John, up the mountain of Tabor. There, he was transfigured. His face shone like the sun and his garments were snow-white. Moses and Elijah, two of the greatest Old Testament prophets, appeared and began to talk with Jesus about the sufferings awaiting Him in Jerusalem.

The impulsive Peter once again broke ranks by suggesting he build three huts so their peaceful stay up the mountain could be prolonged. Then suddenly they were covered with a bright cloud and the voice of God said, "This is my Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour. Listen to him."

The message from God was crystal-clear: listen to and accept the teaching of Jesus.

Many of us are like Peter. We would like the glory without the suffering. That is not the way that Jesus intended for his followers. For us there is only one way. At the Last Supper, Jesus said, "I am the Way, the Truth and the Life." So we walk with Jesus. Any other way means that we have lost our way. The road we walk with Jesus



will lead to Calvary.

We do not walk that road alone. Jesus promised us that he would be with us till the end of time. When he allows suffering to come into our lives – perhaps sickness in the family or the death of a loved one – Jesus is by our side, helping us to carry our share of his cross. Whatever our suffering, physical, mental or emotional, Jesus has endured it himself and he knows what we are going through. He always gives us the grace to carry our cross to Calvary.

The Transfiguration teaches us first to listen to Jesus as he speaks to us in the Scriptures, through his Church, in the events of our daily living. What he says may not always be what we want to hear but we believe in his love for each of us and wants only what is best for us.

The Transfiguration also reminds us that after the suffering there is the glory. In this life suffering is part of the human condition. When Jesus became man, he accepted suffering and died on the cross. But Calvary was not the end. So let us walk with Jesus to Calvary and then we will share in His glorious Resurrection.

Dear Parishioners,

At the last Parish AGM, a proposal was put forward to change Mass times, which mostly affect the current Masses during the week. Having further discussed this matter with the Pastoral Parish Council, I would like to hold a process of consultation by asking for your comments and/or suggestions on the proposal to change Mass times. For your information, the table below has a list of current and proposed Mass times:

Day of the week	Current Mass times	Proposed Mass times
Monday	7.00am	9.00am
Tuesday	5.30pm	6.00pm
Wednesday	8.00am	9.00am
Thursday	7.00am	9.00am
Friday	5.30pm	6.00pm
Saturday morning	8.30am	9.00am
Saturday evening (Vigil)	6.30pm	6.00pm

The reasons for the change of Mass times are:

- The new Mass times are more consistent and will be easier for parishioners to remember. There will no longer be a need to change Mass times for public holidays on an ad hoc basis.
- The times for morning Masses will encourage more parents to attend after they drop-off their children at school. It is also to encourage children from the school to attend daily Mass on a weekly basis.
- It will be easier for retirees and senior parishioners to follow their routine and attend Mass at a later time in the morning.
- It will be advantageous for the senior parishioners to attend the Saturday Vigil Mass from 6.00pm in winter and not have to worry about going out to the car park in the dark.
- Parishioners who work will find 6:00pm a more convenient time on Tuesday and Friday evenings to attend Mass.

Please write your comments on a slip of paper available in the Church Foyer and place it in the wooden box labeled "Your comments/suggestions on Mass times". The closing date for comments will be **Tuesday 28th March 2017**.
