First Reading - Dt 4:32-34. 39-40

A reading from the book of Deuteronomy

Moses said to the people: 'Put this question to the ages that are past, that went before you, from the time God created man on earth: Was there ever a word so majestic, from one end of heaven to the other? Was anything ever heard? Did ever a people hear the voice of the living God speaking from the heart of the fire, as you heard it, and remain alive? Has any god ventured to take to himself one nation from the midst of another by ordeals, signs, wonders, war with mighty hand and outstretched arm, by fearsome terrors – all this that the Lord your God did for you before your eyes in Egypt?

'Understand this today, therefore, and take it to heart: The Lord is God indeed, in heaven above as on earth beneath, he and no other. Keep his laws and commandments as I give them to you today so that you and your children may prosper and live long in the land that the Lord your God gives you for ever.'

Second Reading - Rom 8:14-17

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans

Everyone moved by the Spirit is a son of God. The spirit you received is not the spirit of slaves bringing fear into your lives again; it is the spirit of sons, and it makes us cry out, 'Abba, Father!' The Spirit himself and our spirit bear united witness that we are children of God. And if we are children we are heirs as well: heirs of God and coheirs with Christ, sharing his sufferings so as to share his glory.

Gospel - Mt 28:16-20

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

The eleven disciples set out for Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had arranged to meet them. When they saw him they fell down before him, though some hesitated. Jesus came up and spoke to them. He said, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, make disciples of all the nations; baptise them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teach them to observe all the commands I gave you. And know that I am with you always; yes, to the end of time.'

Hospitality in the Trinity

On most Sundays we celebrate some aspect of what God has done for us, but on Trinity Sunday our celebration is focussed on the sheer wonder of who God is, as distinct from what God has done.

It is no accident that we celebrate Trinity Sunday at this particular point in the liturgical year – after the Easter events of his death, descent into hell and resurrection, and then ascension and Pentecost – because it was through those very events that the disciples came to the profound realisation that God is a Trinity of three divine persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, three distinct persons, while yet one and only one God.

Certainly, this is no easy mystery to comprehend. It has taxed the minds of Christian thinkers for centuries. Nevertheless, the early Christians, as well as saints and mystics throughout the ages, have been unswerving in their testimony that this is the mystery at the core of our faith. We, like them, profess this faith in the Creed each Sunday and each day in the Sign of the Cross.

Like the early disciples and the saints and mystics, we too are invited into relationship with these Three, the Trinity. The feast of Trinity Sunday encourages us – individually and together – to enter ever more deeply and prayerfully into this mystery of God's threefold love, and to allow it to enter into us, and to work in us. This indeed is grace: it is God, the Trinity of three divine persons, abiding in us and transforming us ever more closely into God's image.

The mystery of the Trinity challenges us in very practical ways in our daily lives. Our faith in God as a community of three distinct but equal divine persons firstly urges us to appreciate diversity in our own very diverse human community. Similarly, the hospitality that we see in the Trinity – the hospitality of each of the three divine persons to each other, and their hospitality towards us, inviting us to share in their life and love – calls us to exercise hospitality in our dealings with each other.

Indeed, the mystery of the Trinity urges us to be whole-hearted and magnanimous in our dealings with others, especially those on the margins – the outcast, the outsider, the lost, the forsaken, the asylum seeker – and to respond generously and compassionately to their needs.

On Trinity Sunday we are also reminded that the Trinity of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit is always there, waiting for us, welcoming us, caring for us, carrying us when we need to be carried, loving us more than we dare even to imagine, and calling us to enter into and share ever more fully in their life, love and hospitality.

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, Amen.
